Foliage plants are likewise sold in pots and hanging containers for indoor and porch use, including bigger examples for office, lodging, and eatery insides.

Cut blossoms are typically sold in bundles or as flower bundles with cut foliage. The creation of cut blossoms is explicitly known as the cut bloom industry. Cultivating blossoms and foliage utilizes exceptional parts of gardening, like dividing, preparing and pruning plants for ideal bloom reap; and post-collect treatment like synthetic medicines,

stockpiling, conservation and bundling. In Australia and the United States a few animal categories are reaped from the wild for the cut blossom market.
